State Budget Cuts-You Can Make A Difference!

Next month, Iowa State Legislators will reconvene for the 2010 legislative session. One of the first and most significant tasks will be to create a budget for the upcoming fiscal year (2010-2011). Given current economic conditions, serious consideration is being given to additional cuts for many State programs. State Parks are among those under consideration. As you may know, the parks do not charge fees for admission; hence their funding for staffing (both full time and seasonal) as well as for maintenance of the Parks comes from the general fund budget.

This past year, the "budget crunch" resulted in a 25% reduction in funding since July 2009. This impacts all of us with less funding available to run and maintain the parks and to provide quality programs. Current projections are to cut funding up to anther 20%! You can imagine that such an additional cut would have a dramatic and negative impact on our park and parks around the State. Many of the programs and services that have been provided at Mines of Spain would be in serious jeopardy. Now is the time to act! Legislators can and do listen to their constituents. Writing a letter now can help tremendously to shape their decision process for the upcoming session. Please write to them asking that they strongly consider limiting and/or minimizing any future budget cuts for State Parks for fiscal year 2010-2011. WATER TRAIL

The City of Dubuque with the support of the Friends of Mines of Spain, Dubuque County Conservation, and Tri-state Trail Vision has applied for a grant for signage from the Iowa Department of Natural Resources for a water trail along the Mississippi River and Catfish Creek. The grant has been approved for the amount of \$6000. The funds will be used to create maps of the route, kiosks that would be placed at the 4 access points and directional signs at designated locations. The access points will include AY McDonald and Riverview parks in Dubuque, Catfish Creek canoe landing in the Mines of Spain, and the boat ramp at Massey Landing. Directional Signs would be place at both ends of the Peosta Channel, the mouth of Catfish Creek and the North end of Nine Mile Island. The water trail would allow watercraft to go up Catfish and Granger Creek as well as explore the Mississippi riverside of the Mines of Spain. An additional grant might be applied for in the future for a canoe/kayak access on the upstream portion of Catfish Creek.



NEW GIFT SHOP TO OPEN

UPDATE— E.B. LYONS BUILDING ADDITION

The E.B. Lyons Interpretive Center Project is coming along steady. The center is really starting to take shape. You can see where individual rooms are located and we can begin visualizing where furniture can sit. October construction started on the center. I can report that the last of the concrete was poured on December 4. All walls and sidewalks are now in place. The frame of the building is up and you can very easily see the layout and the size of the new addition along side the old. The library/reference room, science

room, archive room and restrooms are framed out in the lower level of the addition. The restrooms and storage areas in the existing building are framed out and all interior walls that were in the building before construction started are gone. The roof and walls have the building about 80 percent enclosed at this time. The drawing to the left is the schematic of what the facility will look like when completed.

EB Lyons Expansion

The Friends of the Mines of Spain Board is excited to report that we are actively moving forward on the EB Lyons Expansion Project. Plans are finalized to add the new addition to the existing structure, effectively doubling its size; while maintaining the original architectural design. Floor plans of the building are complete.

The new addition will feature a large room on the main floor; specifically for programs presentations and conferences. The lower level will have space for "hands-on" labs. Additional meeting rooms, office space, food preparation area and needed storage will also be included in the addition. We are in the phase of the project to raise the necessary funds. We are very pleased to report that we have already received approximately \$1,300,000 towards the project with \$500,000 to go. Many generous gifts have been donated to the project. We are very thankful for the generosity of so many people and businesses from the area and abroad.

The process of grant writing, direct mailings, and personal visits to potential donors continues. The State of Iowa has entered into an agreement to provide \$240,000 towards in-kind work, an expansion to the parking lot and upgrades to water and sewer on site. We are moving forward, donations are coming in and we are anxious to begin construction. All donors will be recognized in the new addition by their level of contribution as noted below
